Save Rockrimmon Library: 'Not Saying Goodbye' Rally @ Noon Saturday Marks Final Day of Library Operations – Community Fights to Keep Doors Open

COLORADO SPRINGS, CO – November 29, 2024 – The grassroots movement *Save Rockrimmon Library* continues to make significant strides in its fight to prevent the closure of Rockrimmon Library. With growing community support, escalating pledges, and increasing pressure on local officials, the group is calling on media outlets to cover the next critical steps in this effort to save a beloved community resource.

Rockrimmon Library's doors are **set to close on December 1**, **2024**, amid growing protests from community members seeking answers. And the minimal response from PPLD Trustees.

Community Impact and Progress

Funding Pledges: In just 4.5 weeks, *Save Rockrimmon Library* has raised \$70,444—enough to cover over three months of rent and utilities, demonstrating the community's commitment to keeping the library open.

Growing Support: The campaign now has the backing of four City Council members, one incoming County Commissioner, and two PPLD Trustees.

Background:

Save Rockrimmon Library was formed in response to the October 2024 PPLD vote to close the Rockrimmon Library, a decision that many in the community feel was made without adequate public input and against the library's mission of providing "equitable access to physical and virtual spaces in safe and inclusive environments." This is a nonpartisan issue affecting residents of all ages and backgrounds in Northwest Colorado Springs. Rockrimmon Library's unique role as a community center provides critical services and spaces that cannot be replaced by other facilities in the area.
