Intents/Objectives/Purpose

Objective: Art appreciation

Visual Arts Curriculum (current Alberta Art curriculum):

1. Explain to the students that today we will be appreciating the mural painting the "Morning Star" by Alex Janvier.	5-10 min	Classroom discussion

Activate students' prior knowledge by asking questions such as: • Do you know the artist Alex Janvier? • Have you ever visited a museum? If so, which one? • Have you ever seen a mural painting? If so, where? Invite students to describe murals that exist in the community or elsewhere.		
2. Clarifying/Creating -Understanding/Concept-Development 1. Modeling and Guided Practice Present the slideshow "The Style of Alex Janvier" to the students. Allow students time to reflect and respond to discussion questions (in whole-class groups, small groups, or in writing).	30-40 min Depending on discussion	Slides
 Coached/Guided-Practice/Seatwork Independent Practice Ask students to create their own artwork inspired by the style of Alex Janvier. 	Time determined by teacher	Art supplies
If necessary, display or print the slide: "Your Turn!" Specify that students should include symbols drawn from their own experiences, culture, family, etc. Ask students to write a paragraph explaining their stylistic choices.

5. Differentiation with specific groups/students

To delve deeper:

- Examine how narratives can provide connections to culture and history by exploring <u>"Les Murales de Legal"</u> (Balado Découverte)-English available.
- Explore the role of art in reconciliation by examining the decision to <u>dismantle</u> (French only) and <u>replace</u> (English Available) the Grandin mural in Edmonton.

- Research the architect of the Canadian Museum of History, Douglas Cardinal, and discuss his artistic influences.
- Research the artistic style of modernism and then relate it to the work of Alex Janvier.
- For English Language Arts, ask students to critique another artwork.
