

Following the service stay for a celebration luncheon for all. You don't want to miss this!



The First Christian Church of North Hollywood has always prioritized our children and youth and has lovingly provided classroom space and on-site programs for them.

In 1945, we opened our first "Vacation Church School" with 104 children. It has continued in varying forms nearly every year since. Years later, Louise Sloan Goben recalled "...attending when I was a kid" and being a classroom assistant when she was in high school. As our new Minister of Christian Education in 1992, Louise created Vacation Bible School (VBS).

In the early 2000s, Pastor Bob Bock was concerned about public school cutbacks in the arts. He dreamed of offering on-campus camps in addition to VBS. That dream became a reality in 2002, when Sheri Izzard directed our first Music Camp with 51 students and 30 volunteers. Classes included Violin, Recorder, Keyboard, Percussion, Movement/Dance, and Music Games. All students ended each day with Choir. A Friday concert featured class performances, concluding with the Chancel filled with children singing their hearts out to family and friends. At one point, enrollment in the camp hit a high of just over 100 students, plus volunteers and staff spread out everywhere in the church. Added classes included: Guitar, Cello, Ukulele, Clarinet, Flute, Trumpet, and Garage Band. We also offered a music class for pre-schoolers and their mothers.

Drama Camp was added in 2005 and, by 2011, Art and Dance-Fit classes were in full swing. In 2015, we added Photography and Song Writing/Lyrics; and Cooking Camp in 2017. Music Camp went on a hiatus for restructuring in 2018, and returned briefly but was cut in 2019 due to budget constraints.

In 2020, all in-person camps were suspended due to Covid. As our church's Director of Children's Ministries since 2017, Jennifer Le'au designed a virtual link to bring a form of VBS to isolated children. She sent weekly letters to them, enclosing coloring pages, crossword puzzles, and other activities. Most

camps resumed in person in 2021, with lower enrollment. Now, attendance is gradually rising.

Our Camp Director, Kristina Frost, reports that since in-person classes resumed in 2021, the very popular Cooking Camp has sessions for older and younger children. They learn basic skills, kitchen cleanliness and safety, and how to use their imaginations with their created dishes. Since 2023, a Martial Arts Camp teaches kids self-defense and discipline. They also gain self-confidence and respect for themselves and others. The popular Musical Theatre, Art, and Photography camps all feature endof-week performances or exhibits and are alive with children's laughter and enjoyment.

For a long time, camps have offered scholarships to those in need. The Bock Scholarship fund has been a great blessing to members of our church family. Most recently, children in families hard-hit by entertainment industry strikes, inflation, or sickness have still been able to attend, thanks to the ongoing generosity of Bob and Peggy Bock and other donors.

Our camps exist thanks to the teachers and countless volunteers who commit time and energy and work together to nurture the lives of the children in our midst. Now grown, many of them bring their own children back for the camp experiences offered on what Pastor Bob called "our incredible corner." Following our first Music Camp in 2002 Sheri Izzard said, "Bob Bock's dream became an unforgettable journey." Today, that dream and the journey live on.




