It's bigger than you think.

Human trafficking is a \$236 billion industry*, making more profit than Walmart, Amazon, Visa, and Google—combined. With 27.6 million people trapped**, it's as common as passing a Starbucks or catching a green light on your commute. These aren't just numbers—they're lives.

It thrives in broad daylight.

Trafficking doesn't hide in dark alleys or distant borders—it thrives in plain sight, happening everywhere, every day. Globally, one person is trapped in trafficking every second—that's 90 people in the time it takes to brush your teeth.

3

Victims are not always who you think.

While 78% of sex trafficking victims are women and children**, men are also targeted. Traffickers exploit vulnerabilities through coercion, manipulation, and even trusted relationships. Right now, the number of people trapped in trafficking could fill Madison Square Garden 1,380 times. It's happening everywhere—and to anyone.

Accountability is scarce.

Despite the staggering scale of trafficking, justice remains rare. A major problem lies in the low number of victims identified by governments. Despite the widely subscribed UN Protocol to Combat Trafficking in Persons, which commits governments to identify exploited individuals, the reported figure of 115,324 victims falls drastically short. Comparing this number to the UN estimate of 27.6 million people trapped in forced labor or sex trafficking in 2022, governments are only identifying less than 0.4 percent of victims, leaving 99.6 percent without help or freedom.
