Giving and receiving feedback seems like such a natural part of the territory in education. It's what we're attempting when we assign a grade or when we have a teacher evaluation. Unfortunately, because of how feedback is structured, it has the opportunity to destroy a team culture or interpersonal relationships. Learn how to set up a feedback system as a living system, customized for your specific scenario, whether it's at the classroom level, the school level, within your district or within your organization. USING LIVING SYSTEMS PATTERNS TO ENERGIZE YOUR LEARNING SPACE

Workshop: 90 minutes | Keynote 45-60 minutes

Patterns exist everywhere we look in natural systems. By focusing on three distinct patterns, we can start to design work flows and classroom flows that operate with more ease and create energy instead of zap it. These patterns can be applied to all sorts of energy flows: everything from lesson plan structures to discussion formats to parent conferences to community programming. This keynote or workshop can be customized to your group and context. It will help connect you to the natural world while also providing strategies and consideration for application.

TEACHING: FOCUSING ON THE SPACE IN BETWEEN ALL THE THINGS

Workshop: 90 minutes | Keynote 45-60 minutes

Our work is dotted with the successes and failures that create the arcs of our careers in education, our times in the classroom, or even our lives at home. Our attention is grabbed by people, grades, assignments, parents, events. Our relationships are based on the individual students, colleagues, friends and family members in our lives. But what if we had a better understanding of what was holding all of those things together? Of what actually made all these things important or unimportant? This keynote/workshop topic focuses on the space between those things—the relationships and how to attune to them better to get clearer pictures of what's actually happening at work, as well as more fulfilling relationships to each other and to ourselves.

THE EDGE EFFECT: CREATING MORE LIFE THROUGH CHALLENGES IN YOUR LEARNING SPACES

Workshop: 90 minutes | Keynote 45-60 minutes

As educators, we know that growth is all about the challenge and cycles of the challenge. Living systems are based on cycles, too: life, death, new iterations. In an ecosystem, if a challenge is too simple or too difficult, the living thing will be thrown out of balance and begin to die. So where's the sweet spot? Looking to living systems... But there is a sweet spot to challenge, and living systems actually have a lot to say about where you can find them and why it matters. This keynote/workshop topic will help you understand where you might be selling yourself or your students or staff short when it comes to challenge. We'll use examples and metaphors from the living world to better understand how to concretely create more challenges in our learning spaces.

UNSUBSCRIBING TO THE ALGORITHM: TEACHING IN A WAY ONLY YOU CAN TEACH

Workshop: 90 minutes | Keynote 45-60 minutes

It sounds like a trope at this point: we're all as unique as a snowflake yada yada yada. It's almost white noise, and that means we've stopped really believing it, or, at least, attuning to it. That's likely because we're distracted or we've gotten used to the short-term benefits of standardization—without really seeing what we're sacrificing in the long-term. This keynote or workshop will give you the opportunity to notice the standardization all around you, remember who you are, and create space to educate from that place. We'll do this concretely with strategies and practices you'll be able to use immediately.
