



Tell us about yourself and your role at the Morgan.

My role as the Community Arts Education Coordinator entails the planning of custom workshops for groups of all ages in the area of hand papermaking, paper marbling, letterpress and bookbinding. Whenever a school, university, club or other various institutions reach out, I organize their experience at our site or theirs, so that they have time to gain



What drew you to papermaking and printmaking?

As a printmaker, I became interested in papermaking. They go hand in hand. I was drawn to printmaking more so after college, when I learned from professional printmakers in Cleveland. Printmaking allowed me to create in a different way than painting. I was able to focus on imagery and develop it in various ways depending on the printmaking techniques. Starting out with intaglio, but then working into woodblock carving. Paper has to be handled in different ways depending on the printmaking technique. It's all very tactile and surprises happen in both printmaking and papermaking!

What do you enjoy most about teaching?

I love teaching students of all ages because introducing new subject matter is eye opening and builds connections. Everyone's different life experience brings something to the classroom or studio, and this is great energy. I really enjoy helping to inspire students to create works of art that they are satisfied with.

Welcome to Fairmount! Tell us a little about yourself.

I have been teaching and performing music for over 20 years at both the college and public school levels. My favorite music is funk and soul because I love to groove!

What fueled your interest in music?

Clay has brought great energy and enthusiasm to the Fairmount Drama Club, theatre summer camps, and more since joining the Fairmount theatre team last year. Clay began acting at the age of 6 and studied theatre and music at the University of Mount Union.

During his time at the University of Mount Union Clay began to form a deep appreciation for the work of Michael Chekhov and Rudolf von Laban. He soon began developing voice and movement workshops based off of their work, and exploring how these movement techniques can be applied to the world of stage combat. Clay believes in the process of "finding one's body" and hopes to help youth and adults alike discover the power their most important instrument holds, so they may tell their stories as beautifully and honestly as possible.

Let's learn more about Clay!

What drew you to theater and learning about stage combat techniques?

I simply love telling stories. As a kid, there was always some tall tale I wanted to tell at the dinner table or during class, and as I got older I began to see that the stories I wanted to tell could be used as a force of good, so I decided to become a theatre artist.

What do you enjoy most about teaching at Fairmount?

I love the feeling of community and support. Everyone has each other's backs and is so kind. I wouldn't trade it for anything!

What's a favorite play you've acted in or role you've played?

Once, I was Shrek in *Shrek the Musical*, it's been my favorite ever since!

What's something you enjoy doing when you're not on stage or teaching?

When I'm not acting or teaching I find myself going on a lot of walks, cooking, and playing a good story focused video game!

Megan might be a familiar face to our Beginning and
Advanced Beginning Ballet students, which she's been
teaching for the last year. In June, Megan took on a new position at Fairmount as
our Director of Development. We sat down with her to learn more about her dancing
journey and what she's most excited about regarding her new role!

Tell us about how you got started in dance.

I started in a ballet-tap combo class when I was four years old and didn't like it at first. I had a change of heart when we started learning our spring recital routine to a song I had on a CD at home. I practiced it so much and knew it so well that my teacher put me in my own line, front and center for the performance. After that, I was hooked. When I was ten years old I started to train more seriously in classical ballet and joined the Cuyahoga Valley Youth Ballet (dba Ballet Excel Ohio). I performed several soloist roles with the company, attended numerous summer intensives all over the country, and had the opportunity to tour to New York City. I couldn't imagine spending my time anywhere other than a studio, so I decided to continue my training and education at Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. From there, I moved to Hartford, CT and performed professionally before returning home to Ohio.

What do you teach at Fairmount? What's your favorite part about teaching here?

I will be teaching Beginning Ballet and Pre-Pointe at Fairmount this semester. I love sparking the same sort of passion and excitement I have for ballet in young students. I also have a degree in Kinesiology and am a Certified Personal Trainer, so I enjoy bringing my knowledge of the body into my classes. I love seeing the "light bulb" moments on student's faces when they feel muscles engage or begin to understand a concept.

You recently took on a new role at Fairmount as Director of Development. What does this entail?

As Fairmount's new Director of Development I cultivate and manage donor relationships, organize fundraising initiatives and events, assist in grant writing for foundation funding, and spread the word about Fairmount in the community. My most important job is getting to know you, the members of our Fairmount family! All of this is important for the longevity of Fairmount and its ability to continue to grow in its offerings and its impact.

Fairmount Dance Company (FDC)

Directed by Mason Alexander, Fairmount Dance Company is ballet-focused, with inclusion of conditioning, pilates, and yoga to complement the well-being of the dancer. The company will also explore other techniques, such as jazz and contemporary dance, to encourage versatility. FDC rehearses and performs additional works, both at Fairmount Center and throughout the community. FDC dancers must be concurrently enrolled at least at the Intermediate Ballet level to participate. Auditions will be held on Saturday, September 7 from 11:30am-1:30pm.

Hip Hop Crew

Directed by Dance Director Andrea Belser McCormick. Hip Hop Crew learns additional dances to perform at community events and organizations throughout Northeast Ohio. Past performances include at Fairmount, Cleveland Cavaliers, Lake Erie Captains, and Akron Rubberducks. Dancers must be concurrently enrolled in Intermediate Hip Hop and participate in weekly Hip Hop Crew rehearsals on Mondays. No audition required.

DANCE & FITNESS

About Fairmount's Dance Offerings:

Ballet: Focuses on development of body alignment as it applies to ballet technique. Students will learn how to balance, turn, jump, and progress across the floor. Concepts such as musicality and performance quality are introduced in the Ballet curriculum. Itty Bitty Combo classes for ages 2-5 include both Ballet and Tap.

Hip Hop: Learn categories within Hip Hop such as poppin, body waves, locking, krumping, musicality, movement hitting, and more! This training will also help students connect more with music in a fun and structured way. Learn some of the most popular dance moves to popular music.

Contemporary Jazz: Develops strong technique, core strength, improvisational and choreographic skills as students gain a better understanding of body awareness, musicality, and character development to improve performance quality. Students focus on learning a variety of contemporary styles including jazz, lyrical, modern, and current-day, cutting-edge choreography.

Tap: Focuses on coordinating rhythmic movement with the feet and ankles. Students will develop speed and clarity in tap sounds while building on steps and rhythms. Itty Bitty Combo classes for ages 2-5 include both Ballet and Tap.

Pre-Pointe: A preparation class for ballet students interested in dancing en pointe. Students will work on strengthening the feet and ankles through conditioning exercises and barre work. Students complete a Pre-Pointe test to ensure readiness for Pointe shoes.

Pointe: Designed for students with previous ballet training. Students will continue to build foot and ankle strength along with endurance for working in pointe shoes. By Faculty permission only.

Spanish Dance: Learn Flamenco, Regional, Classical, and Escuela Bolero styles. Emphasis on technique which includes compas, footwork, Palmas, upper body and arms, and castaneting.




