

## Case Manager

FamilyAid Boston, the city's largest human service agency solely focused on ending childhood and family homelessness, is seeking a Case Manager to support families living in a shelter setting, as well as to families who have recently moved from shelter into permanent housing.

The Case Manager develops and implements plans that assist families' transition from shelter to permanent housing within guidelines established by program and contract holder Department of Housing and Community Development, and to support recently housed families in maintaining long term housing stability. The successful candidate will have a bachelor's degree, with more than two years of successful experience in social services. Bilingual (Spanish), BSW or MSW are all highly desired qualifications.

With a mission to empower parents facing homelessness to secure and sustain housing and build foundations for their children's futures, FamilyAid is on a fast track to curb the region's growing homelessness crisis. Its nationally recognized homelessness prevention, diversion, emergency shelter, and supportive affordable housing programs serve more than 2,000 children and parents each year.
