TROPEA

The name Tropea alone signals (to Italians and foreigners alike) sun, sea, and unforgettable sceneries. This splendid setting lies along the Coast of the Gods, also known as the "Beautiful Coast" (Costa Bella) for its inspiring panoramas and its vicinity to the splendid Aeolian Islands. **Tropea is the most enchanting spot on the Calabrian Coast.**

You can easily assume that summer is a very busy time here, but we have to say that in this area, towns visited by tourists can offer much better services compared to other areas inland.

The town offers dramatic views in the region and its stretch of coastline is known as Coast of the Gods. The historic center of the town is located on top of the cliffs, looking over to the sea.

The bus service connects Tropea to the airport regularly and there is a train station to connect to Naples and the north.





AMANTEA

The town is split into two different areas: the old town center perched on the top of a rock hill, and the lower area developed along the coast. The narrow lanes and streets of the old center are guite picturesque. Amant

ea is dominated by the ruins of an ancient castle, the historical center is rich in history and beautiful palaces, the lower part of the town is the "new " residential area and in a short walk, you reach the Marina and the sandy beaches.

The airport is only 30 miles away while the train station is right in the town.

PALMI

Built on an ingenious system of terraces that from the side of a mountain gently slope down the sea, Palmi is one of the most vital cities of the area, rich in history and natural beauty.

The terraces offer exceptional views of the Messina Strait and the Eolian Islands, are placed at different heights and connected by crags, cliffs, and small beaches.

The coast is dotted with caves, beaches suitable for every need, and imposing rocks, which stand out in the crystal clear waters. The city of Reggio Calabria and its airport is very close and well connected to Palmi and if you like to discover more from Palmi you'll easily jump onto Sicily.

Population 18,000



SOVERATO

Soverato, set like a pearl in a beautiful gulf, stands on a hilly slope between the valleys dug by two rivers.

Soverato is divided into three contingent zones, the first on the coast, the second on the low hill, not far and slightly detached from the first, and the third, at the same height as the second, represents what remains of the old Soverato, destroyed by the 1783 earthquake.

The population is mainly centralized in the lower part of the town. The sand of the long beaches of Soverato is white and fine, the waters crystal clear with a sandy bottom. Soverato faces the Ionian Sea and Greece that has strongly influenced the whole area. The airport is less than an hour away and the main city of Catanzaro is a 30 min drive only.

CHIANALEA

This little town is a real jewel also nicknamed the Venice of the South, the main street, continually interrupted by narrow and characteristic lanes on the sides that open glimpses of incomparable impactful landscape between the houses, some of which date back to the 1600s, leaning against each other.

Chianalea belongs to the municipality of Scilla, a town nearby also facing the sea. Both towns are to be suggested because of the convenient location, in less than 30 minutes you can reach the airport and the city of Reggio Calabria and Villa San Giovanni to catch the ferry to Sicily.
