Dear people of Tabor Lutheran Church,

By now, many of you have heard the news that the New England Synod – ELCA has issued for me a 'Letter of Call' to serve as your Transitional Pastor! I am so excited to have this opportunity to serve among you as we go out into the world to proclaim God's love through Jesus Christ.

More than a year ago, your first transitional Pastor, Pastor Maria Hammons, accepted a call to serve as an assistant to the bishop. During her time with Tabor, the congregation completed the transitional ministry tasks needed to prepare you to call a 'settled' pastor (Pastor Bud and Pastor Marjo were your most recent 'settled' pastors). Unfortunately, at the current time, there aren't many candidates available in the synod, and this has led to a much longer pastoral vacancy than anyone imagined. Most of you have noticed the pastoral leadership void. While you have had many great supply preachers on Sundays, it's just not the same as having pastoral leadership present for the remainder of the week. After taking much time in prayer and discernment, I feel ready to re-enter active pastoral ministry as a transitional pastor and, more importantly, as Tabor's transitional pastor.

What will this new period of transitional ministry look like? In addition to fulfilling the main duties of any pastor (leading worship, preaching, teaching, providing pastoral care through all of life's twists and turns, joys and sorrows), we will be revisiting some of the transitional ministry themes you worked through with Pastor Maria, just to see how the people are Tabor are doing during this prolonged pastoral vacancy. I call it, "taking the temperature". I plan to do this by encouraging small group gatherings, where you may share your concerns, your fears, your joys, your dreams. As you share, know that the Holy Spirit guides you and that God mourns and rejoices alongside you and me. I also want to encourage you all to dream. Throughout the Hebrew scriptures, God's call is revealed to one by way of dreams, like with Jacob, dreaming of the ladder or staircase between Heaven and Earth, angels ascending and descending. Often, our rational, logic-driven, conscious minds prevent us from seeing the plethora of possibilities that the Holy Spirit is placing right in front of us. Many of you have been a part of Tabor's congregation for many decades. There is a rich history and tradition at Tabor to celebrate. But sometimes, when one's mindset sits too long in such a joyful past, trying to figure out how to re-create what has passed, one often misses out on what God is doing right now and to where God might be leading Tabor to in the future. During this year with you, as your transitional pastor, I would simply like to encourage you to dream, to vividly imagine the new ways God may be reaching out to Tabor and what doors God may be opening for you.

Tabor Lutheran Church is not alone. Most congregations struggle with declining membership, aging active members, the lack of children, youth, and younger adults. Many other congregations across the ELCA and in all mainline denominations are going through lengthy pastoral vacancies. No doubt, this is a very discouraging time for most churches and those of you who love and serve faithfully, wondering if there even will be a church 10 years from now. However, remember that each Sunday in worship, we proclaim resurrection. We rejoice hearing that "death has lost its sting" and that the tomb could not contain the Son of God. While death and decline is a natural part of life, our faith in Jesus Christ sustains us during times of despair with the promise of new life—something new is coming, just around the corner! Do you not perceive it?

God is doing a new thing, in the world and right here, in Branford, Connecticut! And God is calling YOU to be a part of this new thing? What does this look like? Over the next twelve months, I hope we can all journey together and see how God is calling you to participate in this new 'thing'. I look forward to reaching out and visiting you, to seeing you each Sunday in worship, to enjoy fellowship with you at Tabor's seasonal dinners, as we "ponder anew, what the Almighty can do"--to quote a line from a hymn we recently sang in worship.

Please email, text, or call me if you'd like to meet for coffee! Feel free to swing by the church, as well. I plan to set office hours in a couple of weeks, as I get a better handle on a regular schedule. And please feel free to 're-introduce' yourself to me. Between my involvement at my husband's church, and due to the fact that I've only been with you on Sundays, I'm having a hard time matching names with faces. Please bear with me, as learning remembering names is a skill that doesn't come to me naturally!

May God's grace and peace be with you, and sustain you all!

Did you know?

Quinquagesima (/ˌkwɪŋkwəˈdʒɛsɪmə/), in the Western Christian Churches, is the last Sunday of Shrovetide, being the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. It is also called **Quinquagesima Sunday**

Quinquagesima Sunday, being the Lord's Day prior to the start of the Lenten season, is known for its meat consumption as people wished to feast before starting their fast on Ash Wednesday, the first day of <u>Lent</u>. Historically Lutheran countries such as Denmark mark Quinquagesima Sunday as the peak of the <u>Fastelavn</u>. After attending the <u>Divine Service</u> on Shrove Sunday, congregants enjoy Shrovetide buns (fastelavnsboller).

Children often dress up and collect money from people while singing. Christians in these nations carry Shrovetide rods (fastelavnsris), which "branches decorated with sweets, little presents, etc., that are used to decorate the home or give to children.


