Our last family home was in Harbour Chines, Coquitlam, situated on 2 acres, framed by forests to the west and east, and overlooking Port Moody and the coastal mountains to the north. It was breathtaking!

Surrounding our spacious family home, where our eights kids lived with Dad and Mom, were all-natural flower gardens, with spectacular water features and rockeries. If you wanted to spend time with Dad, and we all did, you had better pick up a rake or shovel and get to work. Mowing lawns and pulling weeds was also the best way I could earn spending money as a kid. No work, no allowance.

My siblings all carried on his legacy and became excellent gardeners. Unfortunately, I preferred playing sports with my friends, or watching TV, or just about anything else!
