

Does it ever feel to you like you are facing the challenges and battles of life alone? Even though it feels that way, what does the Bible tell us is the truth about our situation? Read Psalms 18:1-3. How does that passage change your perspective?

While the Bible tells us that the "battle belongs to the Lord", there is a part that each of us play. God does His part, and we do our part. Think about one challenging situation you are in right now. What is God asking YOU to do in it?

God often asks us to be like Aaron and Hur and support those who are weary and struggling, knowing there will come a time when we will need that support. How can you support and encourage someone who is facing a battle? Read 1 Corinthians 12:4-7. What has the Holy Spirit given you to help someone?

[LEAD (YOURSELF)]

At the end of the battle in Exodus 18, God wanted Moses to write down what had happened as a permanent reminder. Think back over the last 6 months about how God has been present and active in your life. Write a note in your Bible or journal so you can have a permanent reminder of God's goodness.
