Sam Lanter from the Grand Canyon Railway has informed me we will need 1500 CU if Babbitt material to repair the crosshead slides. I have recently received this information so the cost is not yet known. I will purchase and drop ship to Sam's shop.

Bob DeGroft has been experimenting with clear coats for the side rods. I picked up a product from Bond Paint Co. which is their recommendation.

I received an email from Dan Dalgarno at Garlock and he has requested I forward a sample of the Teflon seal from the flexi bolt sleeves. Monday I plan to mail it out.

Don't forget the Winter Party on January 11th at Quarter's Westside @ 6:00 pm. We have 42 that have made reservations. Please pay Gail your money so we can pay the bill at the end of the evening. This does include the tip. \$18 per person should be enough including tax per person.

<u>Plans & Funding Report</u> – by Andy Rutkiewic **CONTINUING EFFORTS**

The Society was well represented at a public presentation of Draft #2 [Final Draft] of the ABQ Rail Yards Redevelopment Master Plan by Samitaur Constructs. Four society members lead tours of the Rail Yard for attendees of the presentation. [Comments on the presentation will follow].

Solicitations of Interest in storage of private passenger rail cars in the ABQ railyards were begun with contacts to AAPRCO, RPCA, SPRC and CTSR.

An additional estimate for site relocation to the Rail Yards will be obtained from Duke City Transfer.

The Downtown Action Team is to be planning for a greatly expanded National Train Day in 2013 that included #2926, ABQ Cultural Affairs and MRCOG. The committee is considering the use of a developing fund raising process that is being called CROUD FUNDING. This process uses the web to solicit funds from a large number of individuals for a project that spikes their interest and they would be interest in supporting. The major web site in this area is KICKSTARTER .com. This effort will be on-going.

COMPLETED EFFORTS

Advertising space for NM Remembers WWII in World War II, Wild West, and Veterans View publications was purchased with NM Tourism Coop Marketing matching grant funds.

Grant requests were submitted by Chuck Mangold to TRAINS mag for \$10,000.00 and it was rejected. He also wrote one to LOWE'S for \$46,000.00 to support staybolt replacement and welding.

A proposal to TRAINS magazine for monthly videos of our restoration was submitted for consideration.

A saturation info campaign to City, County and State government personnel using "The #2926 Story" video was begun.

The Society was effectively represented at the annual meeting of the New Mexico Association of Museums with an information table and a donation of a lantern for their fund raiser.

DEVELOPING EFFORTS

Our champion Grant writer Chuck Mangold together with Albert Leffler will evaluate the feasibility of organizing a #2926 night at an ABQ Isotopes baseball game in the 2013 season as a fund raiser.

We currently have direct contact information for FOX 2 "NM Style" [sale.jayson@krqe.com] to interview and film our activities for a free segment on that program. When they have unsold time we will be contacted.

Approximately 250 people went through the Rail Yard tours. We did a great job giving the tours during this time. The city was forever grateful to us. The city respects us and our knowledge and the organization as a whole.

New Business

Dr. Mike has about three requests to speak to historical groups; Las Vegas, NM, Las Cruces, NM and possibly one in California.

Christmas card is now for sale in our store for \$10. It's a larger print that can be framed.

Our official response to the City Rail Yard project has been sent out and we made 11 official copies.
