# WEDDING DAY TIMELINE

Whether you choose to do a first look or the traditional (not seeing each other until the bride walks down the aisle), I will work with you to create the perfect wedding day schedule. Take a look at the examples below to get a general idea of when to plan for photos on your wedding day.



## SAMPLE ORDER OF EVENTS

#### TOTAL ESTIMATED TIME: ~10 HOURS

#### getting ready & detail photos: 2 hours

This includes time for hair and makeup, getting dressed, and capturing detail shots of the wedding attire, rings, and other accessories.

#### first look and couple portraits: 1 hour

Allow time for you and your partner to have a private moment and capture photos together before the ceremony.

#### wedding party photos: 1 hour

Allocate time for group photos with the wedding party, including bridesmaids, groomsmen, and any other special attendees.

#### ceremony: 20 minutes to 1 hour

The duration of the ceremony can vary depending on the type of ceremony and any special rituals or traditions involved.

#### cocktail hour / family photos: 1 hour

Guests can enjoy a cocktail hour while you and your partner take photos with immediate family members and close relatives.

#### grand entrance: 15 minutes

This includes the announcement of your arrival and any special introductions.

#### dinner: 1 to 1.5 hours

Account for the time it takes for guests to be seated and served their meals.

#### speeches and first dance: 30 minutes to one hour

Allocate time for speeches from the wedding party or close family members and your first dance together.

#### cake cutting, boquet/garter toss: 30 minutes

Include time for the cake-cutting ceremony and any additional activities like the bouquet and garter toss.

#### dancing: 2 to 3 hours

Guests can enjoy dancing and celebrating on the dance floor.

#### grand exit: 15 minutes

End the evening with a grand exit, such as a sparkler sendoff or a farewell with your guests.


# FIRST LOOK

### WONDERING IF A FIRST LOOK IS RIGHT FOR YOU?

It's a special moment when you see your other half for the first time on your wedding day. It'a a moment worth remembering whether you do or a first look or wait for an epic reveal as you walk down the aisle.

If you're wondering whether or not to do a first look on your wedding day, here are some ideas to consider.







### 1. a first look gives you a quiet moment alone

Wedding days go by in a blur. As soon as the day begins there is so much to do and so many people to see. Doing a first look will give the two of you a moment alone (with a camera shooting from afar) to soak it all in and think through what the day means to you.

### 2. more time for pictures & your reception

When you have a first look, we can take pictures of the two of you, the bridal party, and some family pictures before the ceremony even begins. This makes the day less rushed and allows us to take more pictures too! Once you're married, we won't need as much time set aside for photos and you can get to your cocktail hour and reception sooner!


#### 3. possibly avoid bad weather

If there's bad weather on the forecast, a first look gives you the option to get pictures done earlier in the day and possibly avoid being stuck in the rain!

### 4. get out all your tears without the audience

A first look give both of you a moment to cry without the audience of all your wedding guests. You can get all your tears out knowing you'll have time to freshen up before pictures too.

First look or not, the first time you see each other on your wedding day will be special.
