



THE UNCONQUERABLE STRENGTH OF LOVE

Yarrow stands for everlasting love, and is connected to the planet Venus (love, harmony) according to astrology. It has medicinal properties historically said to cure bleeding soldiers' wounds-making its powers-healing, harmony, undying love, unconquerable.

Pale roses symbolize platonic love and friendship. This calm, spare aesthetic of this piece points to the abiding peace that comes from deep friendship.

GERANIUM

Geraniums stand for health, joy, and protection. Folklore says that snakes (treachery! poison!) and flies (dessication! annoyance!) will not go near a white Geranium.

DAHLIA

These Dahlias are associated with darkness, for obvious reasons, and possibly retained this association for the unsolved "Black Dahlia Murder" in the early 1940's.

AURICULA



THE ARTIST 60X48" OIL ON PANEL \$18,500

Auriculas symbolize art and creativity. In the Victorian era, they were collected with the same passion as fine porcelain or silks from across the sea. As an artist who is both obsessed with Auriculas, and antique porcelain, this piece is a favorite.

TULIP

Striped parrot tulips, meaning: individuality and boldness. Unlike their more staid solid colored cousins, these tulips grab attention with bright color combinations and shapes. They are a welcome reminder that there is beauty in being true to oneself.

NASTURTIUM

Nasturtiums, meaning: Patriotism and heroism.

These lovely flowers are planted all over France. Their leaves are thought to look like the shields used by soldiers in ancient Rome-hence the connotation of heroism. In trying to think of a patriotic and heroic lady, Jean d'Arc instantly came to mind.

Dianthus, also called Sweet William, symbolizes brokenhearted, lovelorn men in English lore.

Chrysanthemum meaning: cheerfulness in adversity.

Warm colors, and aptly named Goldenberries symbolize the warmth of the sun to compliment this flower's symbolism.

This piece is named for Berthe Morisot-a female painter respected and loved by her impressionist peers, Edouard Manet and Edgar Degas, among others. Living during the Victorian era, it seems appropriate that this piece of a flower, which during that time was a symbol of art itself, as well as beauty, elegance, and confidence, be named for this fiercely beautiful female painter in an age of men.
