

Metra Rail Service Coming to Rockford No Transit Tax Changes (Yet)

Currently, Rockford, Winnebago, and Boone Counties are not included in the

taxing district of the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA), which currently

funds CTA, Metra, and Pace services through sales taxes, real estate transfer taxes and other transit-related fees in Cook and the five collar counties.

A recent proposal to replace the RTA with a new Northern Illinois Transit Authority (NITA), would have restructured governance and expanded funding mechanisms with future considerations to include Rockford. It passed the <u>Illinois</u> <u>Senate but did not advance in the House</u>. That may change if the proposal is reintroduced and if passed could increase taxes in Rockford significantly to fund the Chicago Transit Authority's mismanaged Pension fund.

As of now, the rail extension will proceed without new transit taxes for Rockfordarea residents. Any changes to taxing jurisdiction would require future legislative action. As for Pritzger's record setting Illinois budget, independent analysts (CGFA) estimate a \$673 million shortfall for FY 2026.

Trump and Kennedy Strike at Illinois' Medicaid for Illegals program

JB Pritzker was caught misleading congress on Medicaid for illegals at a Congressional Hearing last week. Pritzker told Congress he was unaware of illegal immigrants receiving taxpayer-funded healthcare, but the facts say otherwise. Since 2020, Illinois has spent more than **\$1.6 billion** on healthcare for undocumented adults, covering around 54,000 enrollees.

Cost overruns forced Illinois to freeze enrollment for those under 65. In order to gain more control over how Medicaid Block Grants are spent HHS recently shared Illinois' Medicaid data with Homeland Security to investigate potential misuse of federal funds. Pritzker's denial doesn't hold up and could come back to hurt him when he Officially Announces his run for the Presidency. Taxpayers deserve transparency and accountability, not political cover-ups. Fred VanVleet-Backed Housing Development Approved

NBA star Fred VanVleet, along with local partners, has received approval to construct up to 180 new rental units a mix of duplexes and four-plexes, on Rockford's east side near Fincham Drive. This project aims to alleviate housing shortages in a market with low inventory, offering family-friendly optioning from \$1,200 to \$2,000 per month.

properties across the state, including the long-vacant H. Douglas Singer Mental Health Center in Rockford. The site has sat unused for years and is now a priority for cleanup and redevelopment. Local officials cite recent data showing a 60% rise in nearby property values, a 39% drop in violent crime, and new business growth as justification for the project. The funding aims to prepare sites like Singer for future private investment, job creation, and housing or commercial development opportunities.

The Rockford City Council recently approved up to \$675,000 for a workforce development agreement with LT Construction. The funds will support a program

training young adults in trade skills through building and repairing city sidewalks. Since its launch, the initiative has restored over 28,000 linear feet of sidewalks near schools, parks, and other key public areas. This year, the program will also support six paid summer interns contributing around 4,300 hours of job training. The council emphasized the program's dual benefit: improving public infrastructure and providing meaningful career paths for local youth.

Andrew Smith - Winnebago 2

Republican Precinct Committeeman

Andrew Smith is the Precinct Committeeman (PC) for Winnebago 2 and has been involved in Republican politics since he was a kid walking precincts for his father's state

rep campaign. By the time he was 12 he knew how to work a walk list before most people finished their Christmas list. As a PC in Winnebago County, Andrew focuses on the

basics, building trust, talking to voters, and helping elect

campaign for the Illinois Supreme Court's newly drawn 4th District. She became the first Black Woman to serve on the Illinois Supreme Court. The effort stretched across 41 Illinois counties from Winnebago in the North to Sangamon County in Central Illinois and required more than 5,000 petition signatures just to get on the ballot. Andrew helped line up endorsements, coordinate outreach, and kept communication going, sometimes seven days a week.

His efforts helped secure one of only two Republican-held Supreme Court seats in the state. "I want that person on the wall that's going to follow the Constitution," he said. "I

was born a conservative. It was about law, fairness, and getting solid Republicans elected."

Andrew encourages fellow PCs to start local. "I start by talking to the Republicans I know. No debates just listening and being consistent."

For Andrew, being a PC just means doing what needs to be done, making calls, knocking on doors, showing up, and following through. It's not complicated, but it makes a difference. And for him, it's not just about politics, it's about the core of who he is: someone who believes in doing the work, standing by his principles, and making sure the right people are in the right places to lead.
