<u>Our Catholic Faith:</u> Students will study the life of Jesus, the teachings of the Church, and stories from the Bible to understand the One who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. Our faith will inform our approach to every academic discipline.

<u>Literature and History:</u> Students will read classic books and stories that explore good and evil, courage, sacrifice, and love. They will also study the history of civilizations that laid the foundation for our world today. They will discuss what these stories and cultures tell us about the universal human experience.

<u>Science and Math:</u> Students will discover the order and patterns in the world as part of God's design. Learning about the stars, animals, and ecosystems can reveal the beauty and truth of creation.

<u>Art and Music:</u> Students will examine pieces of art and listen to classical music, cultivating habits of careful observation and developing a deep appreciation for creative expression. They'll also learn skills to create their own beautiful pieces of art and music.







#### Q: What will be the typical class size?

As we open in the Family Life Center this year, classes will typically have an average of 15 students per class. PK and Kindergarten classrooms will have both a teacher and a teaching assistant.

#### Q: What will be the vaccination policy?

#### Q: How much is tuition?

Tuition is \$10,480. The registration fee is \$380.

#### Q: How can we apply for financial aid?

#### Q: Will you have before and after school care?

Yes, we are developing offerings for early drop-off and after school care. Before-school care will be included in the cost of tuition. After-school care will be at additional cost.
