LEGISLATIVE AND BUDGETARY PROGRESS IN THE 2025 GENERAL ASSEMBLY SESSION

Key legislation passed and its impact on PrinceWilliam and Stafford Counties:

HB2617 - Virginia Commission on Women's Health

- Creates a legislative commission to focus on maternal health and women's health policy.
- Local impact: Strengthens women's healthcare services in Prince William and Stafford.

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HB2539 - Medicaid Dental Coverage for Pregnant Women

- Expands Medicaid to cover comprehensive dental care for pregnant women.
- Local impact: Supports mothers and infants' health, reducing birth complications.

HB2446 - Postpartum Depression Education Act

- Directs the Virginia Department of Health to launch a maternal mental health campaign.
- Local impact: Improves access to perinatal healthcare in Stafford and Prince William.

HB2413 - Electric Utility Reform and Grid Modernization

- Requires energy companies to plan long-term grid investments with transparency.
- Local impact: Ensures lower energy costs and grid reliability for residents.

HB2393 - Human Trafficking Victim Expungements

- Allows survivors of trafficking to clear past criminal records.
- Local impact: Helps victims rebuild their lives and reintegrate into society.

HB2387 - Wrongful Death Statute of Limitations

- Extends legal time limits for families to file wrongful death lawsuits.
- Local impact: Provides families justice in cases where criminal investigations delay civil suits.

HB2384 - EMS Vehicle Regulations

- Updates regulations to allow fire department branding on EMS vehicles.
- Local impact: Supports fire and EMS departments in our region, increasing safety visibility.

HB2383 - Transient Occupancy Tax Reform

- Clarifies tax collection for short-term rentals like Airbnb, ensuring funds stay local.
- Local impact: More tax revenue for schools, roads, and emergency services in Prince William and Stafford.

HB2371 - Contraceptive Health Insurance Coverage

- Ensures no-cost coverage for contraceptive drugs and devices.
- Local impact: Expands healthcare access for women, reducing financial barriers
- for residents in Prince William and Stafford Counties.

HB2362 - Delinquent Property Tax Sales Reform

- Protects property owners by improving the legal process before real estate is sold due to unpaid taxes.
- Local impact: Ensures that homeowners and lienholders are properly notified, reducing foreclosures in our communities.

HB2356 - Prevailing Wage and Apprenticeship Requirements

- Ensures public service contractors pay fair wages and hire apprentices, boosting job training.
- Local impact: Helps workers in energy and infrastructure jobs earn a living wage and access apprenticeship programs.

HB2352 - Dumfries Charter Updates

- Modernizes the town's charter by clarifying government procedures and local powers.
- Direct impact: Provides clear rules for town governance, including mayoral duties and emergency ordinances, improving efficiency in local government.

BUDGET WINS AND LOCAL IMPACT

Putting Money Back in Your Pocket: Over 1 billion in tax cuts for Virginians, including tax rebates of \$200 per individual and \$400 per couple by October 2025, plus a permanent increase in the standard deduction to help lower tax burdens.

Supporting Working Families: The Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) is expanding, providing more relief to lower-income households.

Affordable Housing & Homeownership: \$20 million for rental assistance and \$15 million for first-time homebuyer grants to make homeownership more attainable.

Pay Raises for Workers: A 1.5% bonus for state employees, plus salary increases for E-911 dispatchers and juvenile justice security staff.

Helping Families Afford Childcare: \$25 million invested in public-private early childhood education partnerships, expanding access to childcare slots.

More Funding for Public Schools: A historic \$782 million increase in state funding for K-12 education, ensuring schools have the resources they need.

Higher Salaries for Educators: \$134 million allocated for a \$1,000 bonus for teachers and school support staff.

Fixing Our School Buildings: \$150 million to improve school facilities, ensuring safe and modern classrooms for Virginia's students.

Expanding Special Education Support: \$52.8 million to better support students with disabilities through enhanced state funding.

Better Healthcare for Virginians: \$869 million investment in health and human services, ensuring more funding for Medicaid, maternal health, and mental health services.

Strengthening Mental Health Services: Over \$40 million invested in behavioral health, including crisis services, mental health workforce support, and expanded psychiatric resources.

Safer Neighborhoods: Extended worker's compensation benefits for law enforcement and firefighters, recognizing their mental health needs.

Clean Drinking Water for All: \$25 million in grants to upgrade drinking water infrastructure in local communities.

Economic Growth & Job Creation: \$35 million to attract new businesses and create good-paying jobs across the Commonwealth.
