- 17. On the last day, the old earth and the old sky will be destroyed with fire: "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything in it will be laid bare. But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, the home of righteousness" (2 Peter 3:10,13). What will the new heaven and the new earth look like?
