JANUARY 21, 2023 "HUNGRY"

[CONNECT]

Have you ever tried intermittent fasting? A long space of time between the last meal of the day, and the first meal of the next day? If so, what were your results? Weight loss? Better sleep? Better clarity? Or...were you just "HANGRY" (Hungry + Angry)?

[ENGAGE]

What stood out to you from this weekend's message?

[GROW]

What's the first thing you think of when you hear the word "fast" in the Biblical sense?

What were some of the reasons people fasted in the Bible?

The definition of biblical fasting is: the deliberate abstinence of physical gratification, for a period of time, in order to activate, or achieve, a greater spiritual goal.

• Discuss this definition as how is applies to you...

What is the "why" behind fasting? In other words, why would I want to put myself through the physical and emotional pain of going without a need, in order to dive into a deeper relationship with Jesus?

Read Hebrews 4:11-12... Have you ever remodeled anything? We usually have to "gut" out the old to make room for the new. Fasting has the potential to bring to the surface some sin or ugliness that God wants to work on. What might that be in you?

The points from this message include: (Discuss how each impacted you in a personal way)

- Fasting reveals my hunger and desperation for God.
- Fasting exposes the real me.
- Fasting prepares me for ministry

[LEAD (YOURSELF)]

READ --- PRAY --- FAST --- REFLECT

How is God calling you to fast during our 24 days of prayer and fasting? This is a very personal time between you and Jesus and is not meant to be shared in a way that brings attention to you instead of your time with Him.

Also, remember your enemy, Satan, doesn't want you drawing into a deeper relationship with Jesus, so he's going to fight you...just like he did Jesus in Matthew 4. Expect it... be ready. But "greater is He that's within you, than he that's within the world." 1 John 4:4
