Understanding Light & Flow

Photography is literally "painting with light," and understanding how natural light changes throughout the day is crucial for planning your timeline.

Morning Light (8:00 AM - 10:00 AM)

Morning light is soft, even, and incredibly flattering for getting-ready photos. The gentle quality creates a romantic, dreamy atmosphere perfect for detail shots of your dress, shoes, and jewelry, as well as candid moments with your bridal party.

Midday Light (11:00 AM - 2:00 PM)

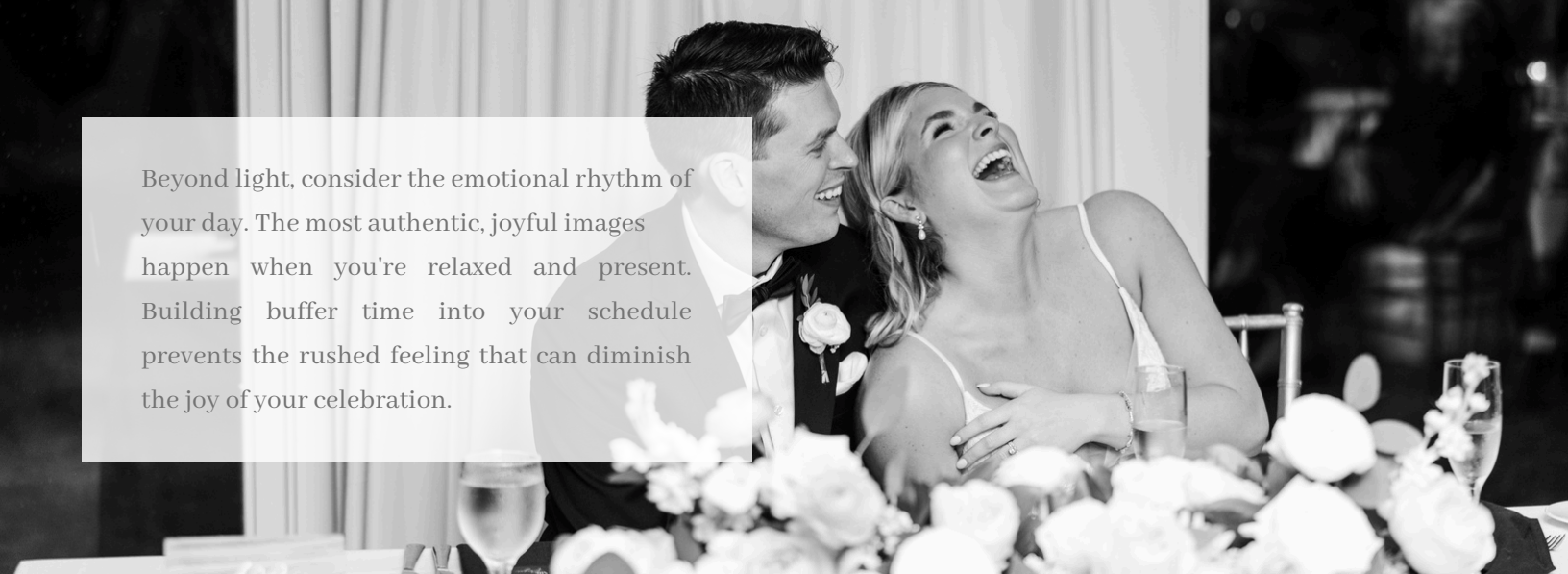
While often considered challenging for photography, midday light can be beautiful when used correctly. This is ideal timing for indoor ceremonies or venues with abundant natural light filtering through windows or architectural features.

Golden Hour (1-2 hours before sunset)

This is the holy grail of wedding photography. The warm, soft light during golden hour creates the most romantic and flattering portraits. Every couple should plan their timeline to take advantage of this magical time.

Blue Hour (30 minutes after sunset)

The period just after sunset provides a stunning backdrop for dramatic, romantic images with a perfect balance of ambient light and artificial lighting.



Beyond light, consider the emotional rhythm of your day. The most authentic, joyful images happen when you're relaxed and present. Building buffer time into your schedule prevents the rushed feeling that can diminish the joy of your celebration.



CHAPTER 2

Getting Ready – Setting the Stage

The getting ready portion of a wedding day is filled with anticipation, laughter, and tender moments that set the tone for the celebration ahead. It's a time when meaningful details—like heirloom jewelry, handwritten vows, or a special toast with loved ones—come to life. This part of the day is often captured through a blend of candid storytelling and refined detail shots, preserving both the emotions and the artistry. More than just preparation, these moments mark the joyful beginning of the wedding story.

Recommended Timeline: 2-3 Hours Before First Look or Ceremony

Why This Timing Works:

- Allows for relaxed, unhurried preparation

- Provides time for detail photography in beautiful natural light
- Creates space for intimate moments with family and bridal party

Pro Tips for Getting-Ready Success

Choose Your Location Wisely

- Select a getting-ready location with large windows and beautiful natural light. Avoid rooms with harsh overhead lighting or small windows.

Prepare Your Details

- Gather all your special details (dress, shoes, jewelry, perfume, invitation suite) in one beautiful area for your photographer to capture.

Plan for Comfort

- Ensure your getting-ready space is comfortable and spacious enough for your bridal party, family, and photographer to move around easily.

The Great Decision: First Look vs. Aisle Reveal

OPTION 1: FIRST LOOK

What It Is: A private moment where you and your partner see each other for the first time on your wedding day, before the ceremony.

Timeline Benefits:

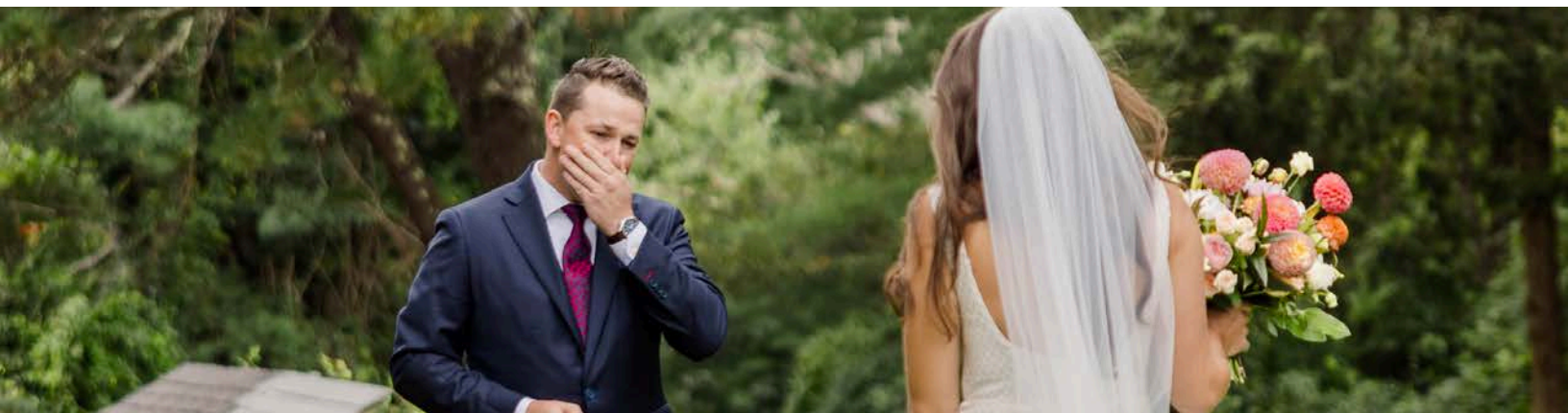
- *Allows for couple portraits in the best light of the day*

Recommended Timeline with First Look:

- *30 minutes before: Family photos*
- *Ceremony time: Relaxed and photo-ready*

Perfect For Couples Who:

- *Want the majority of photos completed before the ceremony*
- *Prefer intimate moments over traditional reveals*
- *Have limited time between ceremony and reception*
- *Want to enjoy cocktail hour with their guests*



The Great Decision: First Look vs. Aisle Reveal

OPTION 2: AISLE REVEAL

What It Is: The traditional approach, where you see each other for the first time as you walk down the aisle.

Timeline Benefits:

- Maintains the traditional surprise and emotion of the aisle moment
- Often creates more dramatic ceremony photos
- Allows for a more relaxed getting-ready timeline

Recommended Timeline with Aisle Reveal:

- 1.5 hours before the ceremony: Wedding party photos (separate)
- 1 hour before: Family photos with bride and groom separately
- Ceremony time: The magical first look moment
- Immediately after the ceremony: Couple, Family & Bridal party portraits in golden hour light

Perfect For Couples Who:

- Value tradition and the surprise element
- Want their ceremony to be the first time they see each other
- Have ample time between the ceremony and the reception for photos
- Don't mind missing part of cocktail hour for photos





CHAPTER 3

Making Your Decision

When it comes to deciding between a first look or waiting for the aisle reveal, there truly is no right or wrong choice—it's all about what feels most meaningful to you as a couple. A first look gives you the chance to share an intimate, private moment together before the ceremony, often easing nerves and allowing more time for portraits earlier in the day. An aisle reveal, on the other hand, builds anticipation and lets you experience that powerful, emotional moment surrounded by your guests. Both are beautiful in their own way, and whichever you choose will be perfect because it reflects your love story.

Consider these questions:

- How important is tradition vs. practicality to you?
- Do you want to be present for your entire cocktail hour?
- How do you handle stress and emotion in front of crowds vs. privately?
- What time of day is your ceremony, and how does that affect lighting for photos?

Ceremony Timing for Perfect Light

THE IDEAL CEREMONY TIMES

This timing allows for golden hour portraits to be taken immediately following your ceremony. The light during your ceremony will be soft and romantic, and you'll transition seamlessly into the most beautiful light of the day for couple photos.

Early Evening Ceremonies (5:30 PM - 6:30 PM)

Perfect for couples who want their ceremony to take place in gorgeous light, and still have time for sunset portraits. This timing works especially well for outdoor ceremonies.

Lighting Considerations by Venue Type

Outdoor Ceremonies

- *Best times: 4:00 PM - 6:00 PM for optimal natural light*
- *Avoid: 12:00 PM - 2:00 PM (harsh shadows and squinting)*
- *Consider: Seasonal sunset times when planning*

Indoor Ceremonies with Windows

- *Best times: 2:00 PM - 5:00 PM for beautiful window light*
- *Consider: Direction of windows and how light enters the space*
- *Backup plan: Beautiful artificial lighting for any time of day*

Indoor Ceremonies without Natural Light

- *Flexible timing: Can work beautifully at any time with proper lighting*
- *Focus on: Creating ambiance with candles, string lights, or uplighting*

Planning Your Golden Hour Timeline

DETERMINE YOUR SUNSET TIME

Research the exact sunset time for your wedding date and location. Golden hour typically begins 1-2 hours before sunset.

Reserve 20-30 Minutes, plan for 10-20 minutes of uninterrupted time during golden hour for couple portraits. This allows for multiple locations, outfit changes, or simply taking your time to create magic.

Golden Hour Timeline Options:

- *1 hour before sunset: Golden lighting starts*
- *30 minutes before sunset: Peak golden hour magic*
- *At Sunset: Dramatic silhouette and backlit photos*
- *15 minutes after sunset: Blue hour romance*

Communicate with Your Photographer

Your photographer will guide you through poses and positioning to make the most of the light, but being relaxed and present will create the most authentic, beautiful images.

Consider a Wardrobe Change

Some couples choose to change into a second dress or more casual attire for golden hour portraits, creating variety in their gallery.

Reception Flow and Key Moments

THE ESSENTIAL RECEPTION TIMELINE

Cocktail Hour (1 hour)

While guests enjoy cocktails, this is often when couple portraits happen (if you didn't do a first look). If you did a first look, you can actually enjoy this time with your guests.

Grand Entrance (5-10 minutes)

Your photographer will capture your entrance and the excitement of your guests seeing you as a married couple.

First Dance (3-5 minutes)

Plan this during good lighting if possible, or ensure your venue has beautiful ambient lighting for this special moment.

Dinner Service (1-1.5 hours)

This is often when your photographer captures candid moments, detail shots of your reception décor, and guest interactions.

Key Reception Moments to Plan For:

- Parent dances
- Cake cutting
- Bouquet and garter toss (if applicable)
- Special performances or surprises
- Grand exit

Lighting Considerations for Reception

Natural Light Receptions

If your reception space has windows, plan key moments like the first dance and cake cutting while natural light is still available.

Artificial Light Receptions

Work with your venue to ensure beautiful ambient lighting. Uplighting, string lights, and candles create a romantic atmosphere that photographs beautifully.

- 6:15 PM: First dance followed by toasts
- 7:00 PM: Dinner
- 8:00 PM: Dancing begins
- 11:00 PM: Grand exit
