

What are 2 of the most happiest moments in your life?

### [ENGAGE]

What impacted you the most personally from the message?

## [GROW]

Go back to the connect question we started with. As you remember those 2 moments, what made them happy? Was it about people, experiences, things, internal, etc? What do those happy moments mean to you now?

Read 1 Peter 1:15-16. Why do you think we tend to substitute the word "happy" for "holy"? What does it mean to be holy? Does that seem out of reach, or like it's impossible for you?

Talk about this description of what it means to be holy: "As believers, we need to be "set apart" from the world unto the Lord. We need to be living by God's standards, not the world's. God isn't calling us to be perfect, but to be distinct from the world."

Read 1John 2:15-17. How does this passage challenge you? How do we live in the tension of loving God and looking forward to heaven... and yet living in the reality of day to day life right here?

Why is it so challenging to see God's blessing and goodness in the middle of trials and challenges? Read John 16:33. Jesus told us to "take heart." What does that mean and how do we live with that kind of hope-filled perspective?

# [LEAD (YOURSELF)]

This week take an internal inventory of your desires and motivations. Are there areas where you've been pursuing your own happiness and fulfillment instead of walking with Jesus in obedience and faith? Take time to confess those areas and seek His forgiveness, grace, and strength to walk with Him.
