2. Rare and Endangered:

There are fewer than 100 mature Wollemi Pines growing in the wild, making them a critically endangered species.

3. Unique Bark:

The Wollemi Pine has distinctive bark that resembles bubbling chocolate.

4. Multiple Trunks:

Mature Wollemi Pines often have multiple trunks, a survival tactic called self-coppicing.

5. Long-Lived:

Some Wollemi Pines can live for over 500 years, and their roots can be thousands of years old.
