Family Preservation



In 2024, our Family Preservation program served five families and 17 children—a smaller number than previous years, but for an extraordinary reason. At the end of 2023, we expanded our focus to include single mothers suffering from past or current abuse. Previously, our program served families facing extreme poverty as the main factor, but we realized that this approach excluded some of the most vulnerable families who were at even greater risk of losing their children to the system.

This shift has allowed us to reach families in their most critical moments. These families require deeper support, navigating trauma, legal challenges, and providing holistic care to ensure the children remain safe while their mothers stabilize. The change has meant more intensive, oneon-one work from our dedicated caseworker, Keyrin Rivas, whose caseload was deliberately minimized to ensure she could focus deeply on each family's unique needs. Her efforts have included forming circles of support around each family—support systems designed to last long after our direct involvement ends, helping mitigate the risk of future separation. The work is challenging but essential. Stepping in before children are removed from their families makes all the difference. We know the devastating effects that institutional living has on children from emotional and psychological trauma to developmental delays. By addressing these crises head-on, we can prevent these outcomes and keep families together, where children belong. Each family we supported this year represents a story of resilience and hope. These efforts go beyond immediate crisis intervention; they lay the foundation for longterm stability, empowering families to heal and thrive.

Family Preservation

Highlights

Delmi's story is one of unwavering perseverance in the face of adversity. A widow and single mother to an autistic daughter, Alejandra, Delmi lives in a remote mountain village in Honduras. For years, her family's livelihood depended on Delmi's work as a coffee picker, a physically demanding job. However, after developing scoliosis, Delmi was no longer able to continue, leaving her family in a precarious situation. The challenges were compounded by Alejandra's needs, which required Delmi to stay home and provide specialized care. Struggling to find a path forward, Delmi was introduced to Identity Mission through an autism school that had been a lifeline for her daughter. It was there that Delmi met Keyrin Rivas, our compassionate social worker, who walked alongside her to create a life plan that allowed her to both care for Alejandra and earn a stable income.

With additional support from Identity Mission donors, Delmi received training and resources to open a small store in her village. The store, named Alejandra after her daughter, quickly became a cornerstone of her community, providing essential goods and generating the income needed to sustain her family. Delmi's resilience and willingness to learn were pivotal to her success. She embraced the opportunity to grow, mastering business skills and finding joy in her work.

Today, Delmi's store is thriving, and her family is thriving alongside it!



MARIA'S STORY

Maria's journey is one of resilience and courage in the face of overwhelming challenges. As a mother of eight children, she endured years of abuse, feeling trapped by the fear that leaving would mean losing her ability to care for her family.

Working closely with our team, Maria explored solutions to create a safe environment for her children. A pivotal moment came when an aunt offered to give Maria a piece of land. With the generous support of our donors, a small concrete home was built. This home not only provided stability for Maria and her children but also enabled her to flee the abusive situation and focus on rebuilding her future and caring for her family. Throughout the past year, Maria has faced her difficulties with remarkable bravery. She attended every trauma course offered, consistently worked on learning to manage her family's finances and household.



The transformation in Maria has been nothing short of extraordinary. When we first met her, Maria would rarely meet anyone's gaze, her eyes fixed on the ground. Today, she greets you with a beaming smile and confident eye contact. One thing, however, has never changed: Maria's warm and welcoming hugs. Maria's progress is a testament to the power of community. Her children have thrived thanks to Tiny Hope school, which has surrounded the school-aged children with love, support, and meals. Sala Evangélica Church has extended friendship and a sense of belonging, providing the kind of ongoing community that will remain critical for Maria's continued success. These layers of support have been instrumental in helping Maria and her children thrive. As Maria continues in the Family Preservation program, the focus remains on building a circle of support to ensure her long-term stability. The goal is for her to graduate from the program by the end of the year, equipped with the tools and relationships needed to maintain her progress and provide a bright future for her children. Maria allowed us to share her story, and it is a powerful reminder of what can be accomplished when we come together to support families in need. Her courage and determination inspire us all to believe in the transformative power of love, community, and resilience.

Foster Care



In our foster care program, a total of 16 foster families provided care for 19 children, including several with special needs and difficult medical conditions. Among these incredible stories of love and commitment, four children found their forever homes through adoption. We want to take a moment to celebrate the extraordinary foster families who care for children with special needs. These families face immense challenges, especially in Honduras, where resources are scarce, and medical care can be difficult to access. Despite these obstacles, our foster families rise to the occasion, often paying for doctor appointments and medications out of their own pockets. Their courage and unwavering commitment are awe-inspiring, especially knowing that adoption is rare for many of these children. Some foster families have dedicated themselves to raising these children into adulthood and beyond, ensuring they receive the love and care they deserve. Honduras' foster families are true champions, embodying resilience, compassion, and faith in action. We know no bigger hearts than theirs, and we are humbled by their example. While changes in government policy have continued to reduce placements into foster care this year, our mission has remained steadfast. In fact, we took a significant step forward by presenting to Congress a proposed addition to the adoption law that would prioritize foster parents for adoption of children in their care.

Foster Care

This change, if enacted, would greatly enhance the possibility of permanency for children, minimizing the trauma of additional separations. Our organization's representative lawyer spearheaded this effort, drafting the document and sharing the case for this critical improvement. We are currently awaiting Congress' response and research on the topic, but the work itself has already borne fruit by raising awareness of the importance of fostering and adoption within a culturally relevant framework.

We believe that if this law is passed, it will unlock new potential for foster care in Honduras, ensuring permanency for children and helping this life-changing model thrive like never before. We look to the future with hope, knowing that the seeds planted this year will lead to a better foster care program that puts the child first.

Additionally, we contracted our lawyer to focus on moving cases to permanency, ensuring that children in foster care have the best chance at long-term stability and love. This effort is critical in a system where delays can mean prolonged uncertainty for vulnerable children. By advocating for legal solutions and working closely with families, we are committed to seeing more children find permanent, loving homes.



Foster Care Highlights

Otoniel and Merlin Alvarez have been a beacon of hope and encouragement in the foster care movement in Honduras for the past seven years.

Their testimony has inspired countless others, as they share their journey of fostering at conferences and churches, urging more families to open their hearts and homes to vulnerable children. When they first considered fostering, Otoniel and Merlin wrestled with uncertainty. With two biological daughters, they worried about how fostering might affect their family dynamics. However, their desire to give back, rooted in a deep sense of blessing and gratitude, led them to prayerfully seek the Lord's guidance. In amazing and affirming ways, the Lord answered their prayers, leading them to say "yes" to fostering. In 2018, they welcomed their first placement, a two-year-old boy. Though the initial adjustments were challenging, he quickly became an integral part of their family and flourished under their care.

Later that same year, they welcomed a newborn baby girl, a joy that the entire family delighted in. Over the years, the Alvarezes poured their love and energy into parenting with patience, grace, and intentionality. This past year brought a significant milestone and a bittersweet challenge. Both children, who had thrived in the Alvarez home, were assigned to international adoptions. While the family had hoped to adopt them themselves, the government's restrictions at the time did not allow for it. Despite the emotional difficulty, the Alvarez family worked tirelessly, alongside Identity Mission's caseworkers, to ensure a smooth and successful transition for both children into their new families. Their determination to see the children thrive, even beyond their home, reflects the depth of their calling and selflessness.

Through this experience, Otoniel and Merlin leaned deeply on their faith. They often remind others that the children are the Lord's, not theirs, and that even their biological daughters ultimately belong to Him. Their trust in God's sovereignty has been their anchor, enabling them to navigate the heartache and beauty of fostering with grace. Remarkably, their biological daughters have embraced the family's calling with open hearts. Despite the challenges, they speak fondly of their experiences as a foster family, seeing it as a vital part of their lives and faith journey.

Otoniel and Merlin's story exemplifies the transformative power of fostering. Their courage and faith inspire others to step into this sacred work.

Equipping the Church to Answer the Call

2025 marks a monumental year for Identity Mission as we officially launch the Church Development Program, an initiative rooted in empowering local churches to reclaim their Biblical role in orphan care. This effort began May of 2023 through a partnership with Backyard Orphans, a Texas-based organization dedicated to equipping churches for orphan care ministry. Their investment in Honduras laid the foundation for this transformative work. It is with deep gratitude that we celebrate this milestone and look ahead to the profound impact this program will have on orphan care in our communities.

A Journey of Preparation and Collaboration

The seeds of this program were planted in 2023, when our team, alongside Pastor Peter and Kathy Hearne of Linaje Escogido, began the meticulous process of translating and culturally adapting Backyard Orphans' training materials into Spanish. This was no small task. It was a labor of love that required countless hours of thoughtful reflection and collaboration. Pastor Peter and Kathy's dedication to this process exemplified their deep commitment to the cause of the orphan and their unwavering belief in the church's role in caring for orphans and vulnerable families. Backyard Orphans not only provided the framework for this training but also encouraged and inspired our partner pastors during their visit to Honduras in 2022. Their message resonated deeply, setting the stage for what was to come. Through their guidance and the steadfast support of their team, we are well prepared to equip churches like Linaje Escogido to step into this calling fully.

Church Development

The First Training: A **Resounding Success**

On December 7, 2024, we hosted our first official training with Linaje Escogido, Pastor Peter and Kathy's church! The day exceeded our expectations, with eight key leaders, including a designated ministry leader, participating in the program. The attendees' engagement and enthusiasm were nothing short of inspiring. They not only grasped the Biblical call to care for orphans but also embraced the practical steps needed to make their church a hub for orphan care in their community.

Pastor Peter's years of preparation—through initiatives like Domingo para el Huérfano (known as Pure Religion Sunday in the U.S.)—were evident in the readiness of Linaje Escogido's selected orphan care team leaders. His heart for the orphan has cultivated a church culture deeply aligned with the mission of this training termed: Solución 1:27. This training was not just a starting point; it was a culmination of years of faithful leadership and vision.



A Vision for the Future

Solución 1:27 is more than a training program; it is a movement. It invites churches to join a network committed to being the solution for the orphan crisis, the mandate shared in James 1:27. Through ongoing support from Identity Mission, churches like Linaje Escogido, and the many that are supporting this program, we will lead the way in raising up and supporting fostering and adopting families, empowering at-risk families to stay together, and preventing children from entering orphanages. The ripple effects of their work will be felt across communities as the church takes its rightful place at the center of orphan care.

In 2025 it is our vision to expand Solución 1:27 to many more churches through our Church Development Program, equipping them to establish orphan care ministries that reflect the heart of God. With every church that says yes, we move closer to a future where foster and adoptive families multiply, and orphan prevention becomes a reality in every community.



Advocacy and training

Throughout the past year, we have been actively engaged in training and advocacy alongside organizations, churches, and government entities to strengthen family-based care for vulnerable children. In 2024, we trained 154 orphan care workers, advocates, psychologists, and other professionals, equipping them with the knowledge and expertise we have gained through years of study and certification in orphan care. Our training programs provide essential support, preparing foster families, orphanage staff, government workers, and church partners to implement best practices that prioritize family over institutional care. Through these efforts, we are shaping a more informed and committed community dedicated to the well-being of children in need.



Advocacy remains a crucial part of our mission, expanding our impact beyond in-person training. The Identify Solutions Conference reached 61 attendees, offering vital education on family-based care, while 12 speaking engagements across the U.S. and Honduras helped mobilize church communities to take action.

Additionally, we hosted three online Advocacy Classes for our U.S. and Canadian partners, ensuring that more individuals can access the tools they need to advocate for children to grow up in loving families. By engaging in both in-person and virtual advocacy, we are building a global movement that empowers churches and individuals to be part of the solution to the orphan crisis.


