LIFE EMPOWERMENT

Life Empowerment is life-changing for our participants who are on a path of transformation. Through these impactful workshops we fill a gap along that path to help move them to the next step. The MSM community of donors, volunteers, and staff together are invested in our mutual participants and support them to discover their God-given potential.

Life Empowerment includes Getting Ahead, a five month workshop; Family Hope, a six month workshop; an alumni program and a leadership development program. Each Life Empowerment workshop brings a community of learners ("investigators") together weekly. In the workshops, participants:

- Build resources
- Identify healthy financial habits
- Enhance emotional health
- Improve relationships
- Reignite faith
- Set SMART goals
- Strengthen communication skills



COVID RELIEF AND RESPONSE

With 40% of Houstonians struggling to make ends meet, MSM knew it had to shift to relief work as quickly as possible to prevent homelessness among our families that were on a path to stability.

Staff were able to quickly adapt processes and train volunteers to provide a remote paperless approach to provide assistance for families that were impacted by COVID.

Efforts to Date:

- Initial Funding \$127,500
- 243 Interviews
- 71% spent on housing costs
- \$125,000 additional funding received

80% of those interviewed during COVID relief efforts, had lost their job or significant wages.


Next Efforts:

COVID Relief

With the impact and restrictions of COVID, we will continue to leverage funding to provide assistance to protect participants from the risk of homelessness.

OPID

OPID will reopen in the near future with a new software application and procedure that will allow MSM to serve clients in a post COVID environment. Partnerships will be strengthened to improve processes.

Community Garden

The garden will focus on providing healthy fresh food for participants and providing a community volunteer opportunity.

Life Empowerment

Seven cohorts are planned for 2020-2021 and will be launched in a virtual classroom until we can meet in person.

Building a Bridges Community including Bridges training and the recruitment of a Steering Committee is a priority. The first cohort of Bridges training launched with over 40 partners, community members and volunteers.

Alumni will be trained to facilitate workshops with two recent alumni already in the process.
