

Let Us Worship 2: Worship in Practice — Final Project

Purpose

To help students apply the biblical principles of worship learned in this course to their own worship group or congregation.

Final Project Instructions

In this final project, you will review what you learned in *Let Us Worship 2: Worship in Practice* by answering questions from each of the eight lessons. Each question focuses on an important principle of Christian worship and how it can be practiced in your own group. For each set of questions, explain how this principle is evident in your worship setting—or, if it is not, how you could include it. Write one short paragraph (5–7 sentences) for each set of questions. This project helps you apply what you've learned so that your group's worship may faithfully reflect God's truth and grace.

Final Project Questions (8 total)

1. Arts Fit for Worship

→ What forms of art or expression (music, movement, visuals, etc.) are used in your group's worship? Are they focused on praising God or on human performance? How can you make sure the arts in worship glorify God and fit your people?

2. The Primacy of the Word in Worship

→ How is God's Word given first place in your group's worship? If it isn't, what steps could you take to make Scripture central in every gathering?

3. The Sacraments in Worship

→ How are Baptism and the Lord's Supper used and understood in your group's worship? How can you strengthen people's appreciation for these means of grace?

4. An Introduction to the Liturgy

→ How orderly and peaceful is your worship? What practices or structures help your group reflect that God is a God of order, not chaos?

5. Liturgy Part One (Confession and Absolution)

→ How does your group include confession of sins and the announcement of forgiveness in worship? If this is missing, how could you include it in a meaningful way?

6. Liturgy Part Two (Service of the Word)

→ How does your group make use of God's Word—through readings, teaching,

or preaching—during worship? How could you make this part of worship more powerful or participatory?

7. Liturgy Part Three (Lord's Supper and Closing)

→ How does your group handle the Lord's Supper and the closing parts of worship? How can these moments send people out with peace and confidence in Christ?

8. Music and the Positives and Negatives of Liturgical Worship

→ What role does music play in your group's worship? How does it help (or sometimes distract from) true worship? How can you choose or create music that strengthens faith and unity?
