See Luke 14:15-24

1. Everyone is invited into relationship.

"Look! Here I stand at the door and knock. If you hear me calling and open the door, I will come in, and we will share a meal as friends. Revelation 3:20 (NLT)

2. Everyone is invited to the table of grace.

For I pass on to you what I received from the Lord himself. On the night when he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread and gave thanks to God for it. Then he broke it in pieces and said, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, he took the cup of wine after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant between God and his people—an agreement confirmed with my blood. Do this in remembrance of me as often as you drink it." For every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are announcing the Lord's death until he comes again. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26 (NLT)

3. I'm invited to extend the invitation to others.

And people will come from all over the world—from east and west, north and south—to take their places in the Kingdom of God. And note this: Some who seem least important now will be the greatest then, and some who are the greatest now will be least important then." Luke 13:29-30 (NLT)

CONNECT

ENGAGE

What impacted you the most personally from the message?

GROW

1. When you hear the phrase “Everyone’s Invited,” what emotions or assumptions rise up in you—comfort, resistance, joy, doubt? Why do you think that is?
2. In the parable of Luke 14, the original guests all had excuses. What kinds of “respectable excuses” do you find yourself using when it comes to fully responding to God’s invitation?
3. Jesus’ invitation isn’t to fit Him into our lives, but to come to Him and follow. What feels hardest to surrender or reorder around Jesus right now?
4. Communion reminds us that the table of grace is not earned. Where do you still feel pressure to prove yourself to God rather than simply receive His grace?
5. Think about your own story. Who was instrumental in inviting you—directly or indirectly—to God’s table, and how did that invitation change you?

LEAD (YOURSELF)

If you were to intentionally invite someone into a deeper experience of God’s grace this season, who comes to mind—and what might a first step look like?
