## Cozy Nook Farm

**Project Description:** Cozy Nook Farm is located in the town of Delafield along Hwy. 18, in an area of high development pressure, and has been owned by the family since 1957. The farm is well-known in the community for its annual Fall Market and Christmas Tree sales. These events provide a unique opportunity for area families to visit a working farm and interact with the 75 cows who call the land home, including many cherished Brown Swiss and Guernsey. More than 80% of the site is underlain by soils classified by the Natural Resources Conservation Service as prime farmland or farmland of statewide importance.

**Why:** The Oberhaus Family preserved their farm and sold their development rights:

- **1.)** To preserve the history and agricultural legacy of their family farm.
- **2.)** To protect valuable open space within the community.
- **3.)** To be an example to other area farmers who might be interested in protecting their farm for future generations.

Where: Town of Delafield, Waukesha County

**Size:** 139-acres are permanently protected under conservation easement
