
- Loving louder looks like <u>AFFECTION</u>.

GROW

- 1. Now more than ever, our world is very loud. Parents are faced with so many influences that are jockeying for attention. Talk about some of the challenges that you or your parents faced raising children. Can you understand why parents might feel overwhelmed? What hope do parents have?
- 2. The message made the statement that God is calling us to be louder than the world. Do you agree with that statement? Is this something that is feasible?
- 3. Showing affection to our children is something that is constantly changing. Talk about the struggles that parents face as their kids get older. How do parents adapt? What can parents do to press in when kids are pushing back?
- 4. Read Deuteronomy 6:5-8
 - In your own words, what is this verse calling parents to? Talk about the heavy responsibility that comes with that call?
 - The parent is called to set the example and establish the priority. In a loud world, this is easier said than done. Talk about some tools, attitudes or resources parents might have to help them mold and shape their children.
