Paper: Arches Cold Press watercolor paper (professional), Canson XL (student grade), Etchr Sketchbook, Arches Journal, Legion Stonehenge Aqua

Optional: artist tape (<u>Holbein Soft Tape</u>), a clip board, cotton swabs

<u>2 cups clean water</u> (these are my fav ceramic watercolor artist cups, but you can use mugs or mason jars! something heavy is preferable)

Reusable towel or paper towel

Ceramic mixing palette, plastic palette, or thrifted dinner plate for mixing

Artist Heat Tool (for quick-drying layers)

<u>Faber Castell Kneaded Eraser</u>
