## Laudato Si' Action Platform (LSAP) Goal

*Community Resilience and Empowerment envisage a synodal journey of community engagement and participatory action at various levels. (LSAP #7)* 

As Marianists, we strive to build communities of equals where all voices are included. Our spirituality moves us to recognize our brothers and sisters disproportionately affected by climate change and to work for the systemic change needed. We are inspired to advocate for justice at all levels, both as individuals and a community. Our emphasis on community enables us to build empowered and just communities among ourselves and for everyone. Our Marianist qualities of flexibility and adaptation help us be resilient and able to respond to difficult situations.

## **Reflection Questions**

- 1. How has your participation in a community empowered you to advocate for justice, whether on a local or larger scale? How has being part of a community made you more resilient in facing the injustices you see around you?
- 2. Call to mind a community or place that you are familiar with that is affected by climate change impacts. How do other factors, such as socioeconomic privilege or injustices, affect this community's resilience when facing the climate crisis?
- 3. Father Chaminade taught that "new needs require new and great help." Where do you see opportunities for "another fulcrum" to better address the climate crisis?
- 4. What action will you take to respond and deepen your ecological conversion?

#### Mindfulness

Our Marianist founders were surrounded by systemic injustice, where society was in chaos and many people were imprisoned or executed. Yet they showed remarkable resilience, building communities and working for greater justice. Think of a community facing systemic injustice. What systemic wrongs do you see? The effects of injustice are often compounding. How does climate change make things worse for this community? Pray for this community, made up of our sisters and brothers in Christ, and listen carefully for what the Spirit is telling you right now.
