

## Sample Job Description For Prayer Captains

Training--develop ideas and establish prayer training throughout the church

Prayer Room-- coordinate prayer room functions/schedule


**Corporate Prayer**-- overseeing and scheduling weekly or special corporate prayer meetings/Sunday service prayer

**City/State/National Liaison**-- informs and seeks to involve local church in city, state and national prayer events

Prayer Chain-- organization and implementation

Special Events-- establishes prayer cover for mission outreaches, dramas, conferences

**Prayer Coordinator for Cell Groups**-- works to link cell groups in prayer for corporate concerns.



Whether you are beginning a prayer ministry with a new team or an existing one, a start-up meeting can bring team members together and get them moving forward. Who should be invited to the start-up meeting? The pastor or church prayer coordinator will make that determination based upon the purposes of your team. Here are few suggestions:

Meeting Participants:

The member of every prayer ministry leader (prayer chain leader, pastors' prayer partner leader, prayer room coordinator)

Intercessors with leadership skills who are potential leaders of the various prayer ministries or those you hope to develop

Other key leaders of the church who may give direction to the team initially and will perhaps not be a part of the on-going team meetings

## Meeting Agenda:

What is on the agenda of a start-up meeting? Common items are as follows:

Prayer: Open in prayer and stop to pray along the way as problems or the need arises

Introduce team members: Ask each person to say something about himself (example name, area of prayer ministry they represent, expertise, role on the team). Ask them to tell something personal as well (something about their family or work outside of the church).

Select a scribe or secretary: This person will take minutes, write them up later, make and distribute copies with follow-up items highlighted.

Explain the purpose of the prayer team: If team members have been accustomed to working apart they will need to know why they are being called together as a team. What is the main goal of the team?

Establish ground rules of how the prayer team will operate: One idea is that each team member heads one aspect of the prayer ministry. Or perhaps some will be on the team because of their administrative or other gifts. How will decisions be made? How will the meeting be run?

Begin the process of instilling vision, mission and cohesiveness in the team. This begins with the leader's enthusiasm.

Review any assignments to team members before the next meeting. Set a date for the next meeting. Close in prayer.
