


"I'M INVITED!"

- 2. How does the master's reaction to the declined invitations reveal God's heart towards those who are often overlooked or marginalized?
- 3. What do Jesus' words in Revelation 3:20 reveal about the relationship He desires with us?
- 4. Reflect on your own life: Are there any "excuses" you have been making that prevent you from fully accepting Jesus' invitation to a deeper relationship with Him? What steps can you take to overcome these excuses?
- 5. Jesus' invitation in Revelation 3:20 is personal and intimate. How can you create space in your daily routine to "open the door" and spend time with Him?

[LEAD (YOURSELF)]

Jesus' invitation to the table is inclusive and has room for everyone. Identify one person in your life who might feel unworthy or excluded. How can you intentionally reach out to them and invite them to experience God's love and grace?
