Why It Matters:

Human trafficking doesn't require kidnapping–most often, victims are trafficked by someone they know or think they know. These relationships often start online. Common tactics traffickers use are romance and deceit to coerce their victims. Often, these romances start in chats on social media or gaming platforms. An increasing form of online exploitation is sextortion, where a victim is tricked into sharing inappropriate content and then blackmailed. You can read more about it **here**.

1. Understand Online Exploitation

Your children's education starts with your own. Go **here** to learn more about trafficking. For example, most sex trafficking victims are trafficked by someone they know, often starting online. Predators will use everything from online gaming platforms that have chat functions, to social media like Snapchat and Instagram which both feature vanishing messages. Educate yourself and then talk to your kids about the dangers.

2. Create a Safe Environment for Conversation

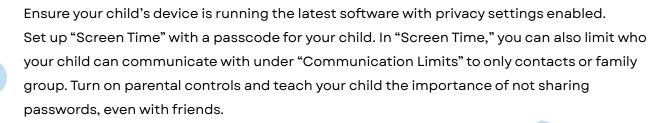
Online sexual exploitation is a deeply invasive and violating experience for the victim. Keeping your child safe requires open conversation, and your child must feel safe to express their mistakes and failures for such conversation to exist. Creating this environment begins long before any issues arise online-take the opportunity now to start having grace-filled conversations about hard topics with your kids so that they feel comfortable bringing dangerous situations to you down the line.

3. Monitor Online Activity and Location

Your child could accidentally come across violent, dangerous, or sexually explicit content. Use parental controls and safe search settings to ensure their online experience is age-appropriate. Regularly check in on what they're viewing and discuss why some content is not suitable. You may consider installing location monitoring software like Life360 on their phones, and requiring that all passwords be shared with you.

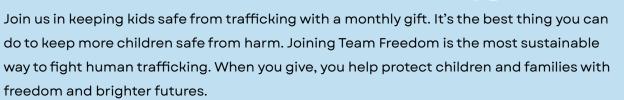
5. Educate About Safe Online Behavior

Discuss with your child the importance of keeping personal information private, including their location on social media. Explain the tactics traffickers use when they manipulate victims through romantic relationships, often starting online.
